Dear Wood Memorial High School and Wood Memorial Junior High School parents, guardians, and community:

Greetings from the home of the Trojans!

On behalf of the entire Wood Memorial High School and Junior High School team I would like to wish everyone a Happy and most wonderful Thanksgiving Holiday. It is our desire that you have the opportunity to enjoy family during this holiday weekend.

With the end of the first semester now in sight it is time to begin the planning process for final exams. Earlier today, Tuesday, November 22, I met with representatives of the Student Advisory Council and our instructional staff to establish parameters for finals. With this said, the following plan has been identified for our final exams (high school only):

- 1. Final Exams will be administered on December 19, 20, and 21.
- 2. The Day One Final Exam will be focused on 7th period.
- 3. The Day Two Final Exams will be focused on 1st, 3rd, and 5th periods.
- 4. The Day Three Final Exams will be focused on 2nd, 4th, and 6th periods.
- 5. Final exam periods will be 90 minutes in length.
- 6. Students eligible to opt out of two (2) finals must do so by the end of school on Thursday, December 15, 2016.
- 7. Students eligible to opt out of two (2) finals must complete a form, to be signed by each instructor. Forms will be made available beginning on Monday, December 12, 2016 and may be picked up from first period instructors.
- 8. Forms must be turned in to the respective last period instructor on Thursday, December 15, 2016. Students missing this deadline will not be able to opt out of a final exam.
- 9. Information on those students approved to opt out of two (2) finals will be finalized on Friday, December 16, 2016.
- 10. An approval process, for student attendance adjustments, during final exams, will be available. Parental sign-off will be required in each instance.

The bell schedule for the final exam days will be provided in upcoming bulletins.

For reference and awareness I have provided a copy of our final exam policy, as found in the 2016-2017 Wood Memorial High School and Junior High School Student Handbook:

Final Exam Policy

Wood Memorial Junior High School and Wood Memorial High School will administer final exams during the last three regular school days of each semester. High school students (grades (9-12) will be required to take a final exam for each class enrolled. Final exams will account for 20% of a respective student's final semester grade in each class. Final exams will not be administered for junior high students (grades 7 and 8).

Note: Courses offered to junior high students, earning high school credit, towards graduation, will have final exams administered.

Students in grades 9-12 may be exempt from taking a final exam as identified below:

- Students with three (3) or less total absences may opt out of two (2) of their final exams.
 - o Absences are defined in full day totals
 - Students will collaborate with their respective instructors to determine the opportunities for final exam exemption.

Acuity Window B testing will take place during the period of November 29 – December 9, 2016. This will involve our junior high school students during November 29 – December 2. Reference information below on the testing schedule.

Thanks to the efforts of Ms. Kelly Hill, Wood Memorial Guidance Director, and Ms. Charity Smith, Oakland City University, Wood Memorial High School has been awarded a \$450 grant from the Indiana Commission for Higher Education. The grant is earmarked for use with the promotion of the 21st Century Scholars program and will be used for two (2) college campus visits, as well as college planning workshops.

I appreciate the efforts of Ms. Hill and Ms. Smith.

A reminder to students and parents regarding a review of the 2016 – 2017 Student Handbook. We encourage everyone to review the handbook, then request the acknowledgement page, of receipt/review, found in the back of the handbook be signed and returned to the high school and /or junior high school office. A copy of the handbook was distributed to high school students during the first day of school; and junior high school students should have access to the document on their iPad desktop. Information of interest:

- The Indiana Department of Education has release preliminary school accountability information for the 2015 2016 school year. The information is currently in an embargoed state, while administration reviews the accuracy of the data used in the process. Schools have until December 5, 2016 to identify corrective responses to any errors noted in the DOE's process.
- The WM wrestling match scheduled for January 25, 2017 has been moved to January 11, 2017. The event will be hosted at Wood Memorial.
- Checkout Mr. Meyer's information post later in the bulletin about his plans to organize a pep band for our winter sports activities. I am excited about this prospect and look forward to having our talented students showcased.
- The state of Indiana has announced that the ISTEP+ Spring 2016 Spring Portal will remain accessible for parent use and reference until March 31, 2017.
