Dear Wood Memorial High School and Wood Memorial Junior High School parents, guardians, and community:

Greetings from the home of the Trojans!

Well, here we are, the final week of the school year. Thank you to everyone – students, parents, instructors, support staff, and others who have helped make the 2017 – 2018 school year a successful one.

There are a number of things yet to wrap up, including final exams, junior high course work, and the collection of student iPads. The information contained in this week's bulletin will help guide you through the schedule for the final week.

Final exam schedules have been identified for our high school students.

A reminder that students may opt out of up to two of their final exams provided they meet the opt out guidelines.

Students wishing to depart the campus, following the completion of their last final of a respective day, must have written permission from the parent. Students will not be allowed to leave and come back during the same school day.

Guidelines include:

1. Student may not have more than three (3) excused absences.
2. Student may not have an unexcused absence, or truancy.
3. Student may not have more than three excused tardies to a class.
4. Student may not have an unexcused tardy to any class.
5. Student may not have a suspension from school.
6. Student must have a minimum of a B- in the class (es) identified for opt out.
7. All student fees must be current.
8. Students will collaborate with their respective instructors to determine the opportunities for final exam exemption.

Additional information as to how absences are aligned to the final exam exemption program may be found in the 2017 – 2018 Wood Memorial High School Student Handbook.

With graduation rapidly approaching I am sure our seniors and their families are excited. This is indeed a wonderful time of year, with the anticipation of a high school career coming to a close, and a new chapter in a life nearby. While I share in the anticipation I do want to remind everyone that much work remains and it is important that we do not lose sight of course requirements in order to ensure all graduation requirements are attained.

With this, I would like to point everyone to some information I believe will be helpful as we near graduation. This information was shared in a letter to parents during March 2018.

Students are reminded the dress for graduation is to be shirts and ties for the gentlemen; dresses, or slacks for the ladies. Jeans, shorts, flip flops, tennis shoes, work shoes, and/or similar attire items are not allowed for this most solemn event.

Note: Any student not following the dress guideline will not be allowed to walk during the graduation ceremony. Students should see me for any assistance in meeting these requirements. Students absent from graduation practice, without obtaining prior approval from myself, will not be allowed to walk during graduation.

Students not having met all Indiana state guidelines for a diploma will not be allowed to walk during the graduation ceremony.

Further, senior students are required to submit a baby picture, as well as senior picture, for use in the graduation ceremony. This should be done as soon as possible. Pictures may be turned in to the junior – senior high school office, or to Mr. Smith.

While graduation is rapidly approaching, it is imperative that each senior student maintain a diligent focus on ensuring academic assignments are completed timely. Further, students are reminded they are expected to adhere to all East Gibson School Corporation and Wood Memorial High School guidelines at all times. Subject to the severity and repetitiveness of any potential violation, a student found to have violated guidelines may be held out of the graduation ceremony.

Students and parents interested in enrolling in an Ivy Tech Dual Credit course should contact the high school for more information. There are a number of courses available, including

Psychology, Advanced Speech/Communications, American History, and many more to students who will be a junior or senior next year.

Preparations for the 2018 Summer School are in place, with instructors prepared to provide educational opportunities for junior high school students in the areas of math and English. Our instructors are in the process of contacting parents of those students whom we believe would benefit from attending summer school. We are utilizing data such as ISTEP results, classroom formative and summative assessment results, as well as the respective student's current academic status when determining the value of the summer school opportunity for a student.

Additionally, incoming freshmen may enroll in their high school physical education course, earning a graduation credit, during the summer school period. By doing so, a student will open up additional academic time for their schedule.

High school courses are being offered in a number of curriculum areas this summer, with a focus on providing students with credit recovery opportunities.

21st Century Scholars program: 7th and 8th grade parents – your child may be eligible for a college scholarship. Indiana’s 21st Century Scholars Program offers income-eligible Hoosier students up to four years of paid tuition at an eligible Indiana college or university after they graduate from high school. In middle school and high school, scholars are connected to programs and resources to help them plan, prepare and pay for college. Once in college, scholars receive support to complete their college degrees and connect to career opportunities. Students in the 7th and 8th grades, whose families meet income eligibility guidelines can apply to become a 21st Century Scholar. Applications must be received by June 30 of the students’ 8th grade year. Scholars must complete the Scholars Pledge and meet expectations of the Scholar Success Program throughout high school and college.
